Our goal is to bring us closer together as alumni/ae, to update you more frequently and meaningfully on the progress of our programs and activities, and to invite and encourage your involvement in our ongoing efforts to bring the MIT crew program up to the competitive level of success versus our traditional rivals that it enjoyed a generation ago.

We want to create a constituency among alumni/ae who are looking for their own way to reconnect with the sport. Perhaps it's by serving as a mentor to current oarsmen/women, or by putting you in touch with crew-mates you'd like to contact, or by visiting the boathouse when in Cambridge, or participating in the annual Reunion Row – or perhaps simply by reading and/or seeing something from time to time that brings back fond memories — or?? It is in this context that, as you'll note in the Annual Report, we ask for your support and vote to rename our organization the MIT Crew Alumni Association.

We look forward to connecting with you more (but not too!) often, about the past, the now, and the future — all in an attempt to rekindle your interest in us as the vehicle that stirs up pleasant and inspiring memories from years gone by and invokes a desire to help future MIT oarsmen and women to benefit from the same exciting, rewarding and profound experiences that helped mold our later lives.

Introduction

On behalf Of the Board of Directors, I begin this first-ever Annual Report by extending our heartfelt thanks to all of you who supported the rowing program at MIT throughout 2005. We are over 4000 men and women who are among the most involved, active, enthusiastic, and contributory of MIT's alumni/ae. Not only has your financial support been extraordinarily generous, but you have contributed of your time and effort as well. There are scores of you involved in the mentoring program as reported in Squaring the Blade recently sent to you.

And as for enthusiasm, nothing could exemplify it more than the participation in the 2005 Reunion Row when we boated thirteen eights, yes thirteen - - a new record!

Your gifts support excellence and innovation in the MIT Rowing Program. Over the past year, with Institute funds, endowment income and, most importantly, your financial support, the rowing program purchased a new 12 person training barge, refurbished the spectator launch, designed, printed and distributed a rowing brochure, and acquired three new advanced user sculls. Most significantly, MIT Rowing, working with Resolute Racing Shells, designed and purchased the first racing eight for lightweight women. We now have underway a drive to raise the money to offset this boat purchase (see Barbara Ostrom's piece on page 8). All of this in addition to the purchase of other new boats and equipment, and in that regard a particular highlight for us was the dedication of a new racing eight in honor of Charlie Butt '41 (see last Fall's Squaring the Blade, page 15).

We have also been able to provide the means for our alumni to better connect with us, each other, and with current student athletes. The improved

FOMITC web site, www.fomitc.org, containing the alumni crew photos is surely a testament to these efforts. Also there you will find the current and past issues of Squaring the Blade.

Early last year, as reported in the Spring issue of Squaring the Blade, Dean Larry Benedict and Department Head/Director of Athletics Candace Royer, established a Rowing Analysis Committee, RAC, to undertake a comprehensive and expert review of the rowing program. Joining me as three of the eight people on that committee were rowing alums Roseanna Means '76, and Dick Millman '62. The RAC report was summarized by DAPER and printed as the feature article in the Squaring the Blade Fall issue. The Friends of MIT Crew enthusiastically support the recommendations of the RAC including (i) assigning a proven leader/coach to the helm of the program; (ii) acquiring and compensating appropriately, top quality varsity and freshmen coaches; (iii) providing the time required to each coach to effectively recruit academically qualified students capable of competing at the Division I level; (iv) administering a comprehensive pre-admission and post-admissions recruitment program; (v) upgrading Pierce Boathouse space with continued attention to renewal of capital equipment; and (vi) re-affirmation by MIT/DAPER of its commitment to rowing as a Division I sport.

We look forward eagerly to the changes that the year 2006 can bring, especially for opportunities to support the efforts of the administration to address current issues with the rowing program at MIT, and to build for the future as the DSL and DAPER begin to implement the recommendations of the Rowing Analysis Committee.

Events and Accomplishments for the Year

As an organization, we conduct a series of regular events involving our members. There were seven of these in 2005, as well as the monthly teleconferences of the Board of Directors.

On the 26th of July 2005 there was an alumni row in Seattle. Joseph Marquardt '97 organized the event that was attended by 17 individuals including 11 MIT alumni.

Continuing an annual tradition the Annual Banquet was held October 16, 2004. Dana Mead, Chairman of the MIT Corporation and a three-sport letter winner at the United States Military Academy was the featured speaker and spoke to us about "Why Athletics are Really Important" (Squaring the Blade for Fall, 2004, page 3). Jesse Lipcon '65, coordinated the event; One hundred and twenty-two students and sixteen alumni attended.

On April 16, 2005 the Charles Butt '41 shell dedication was attended by 52 people; twelve of them were MIT alumni. Charlie's wife and other members of his family attended, and Charlie's son Charley, Varsity Lightweight Men's coach at Harvard, told us about his father. (Squaring the Blade for Fall, 2005.) Ian Hutton and Jesse Lipcon '65 organized the event.

Three hundred and one crew alumni participated in the Annual Board elections; this was a higher percentage of members participating in the election than is the case for the Alumni/ae as a whole. Balloting closed on June 1, 2005. Mike Scott '73 managed the voting process that saw Mark Findeis '81 and Barbara Ostrom '78 elected to the board. A list of the Board of Directors that served during 2005 is given later in this report, along with their mini-bios.

Twelve MIT Alumni and eight others participated in the June 2, 2005 IRA Alumni Master's Race. William Gadzuk '63 was the coordinator for MIT participation. Also competing were crews from Cornell, Penn, Rutgers, Syracuse, and Brown

The biggest Reunion Row ever was held on June 5, 2005 with 130 MIT alumni and 40 non-MIT alumni participating. The class of '65 won its heat and the final, both in tightly contested races, repeating their success of five years earlier. Ron Young '65 and Stu Schmill '86 worked to make this event so successful. Stu also provided the following commentary on the proceedings:

It was a beautiful day on the Charles River. Come to think of it, any day on the Charles River is a beautiful day — I even find myself missing those with ice forming on the oars and on my sweats. But the one I am referring to was in June, so no ice; just flat water and blue skies. On June 5, 2005, a record number of former rowers and coxswains and their guests gathered at the Pierce Boathouse for the annual reunion row.

Thirteen eights raced in two heats. Richard Powers '40 and William Vandersteel '40 were there celebrating their 65th reunion, with Al Bowen '45 back for his 60th. A full boat of nine members of the 50th reunion class of 1955 competed as well. In addition, the class of 1985 entered two boats, the "distinguished" and the "honorable." No need to report which finished ahead of the other. The classes of 1980 and 2000 each entered both a men's and a women's boat.

Advancing to the final were the classes of 1965, 1975, 1980 women, and 1995. It was a very exciting race. The class of 1965 had won





five years ago. The classes of 1975 and 1980 had certainly seen great success when they were undergraduates. And the class of 1995 had youth on their side. In the end, the class of 1965 was once again victorious, besting their time of five years ago by one-tenth of a second. As it takes about five years to fully recover from one of these, I am sure that each of these crews will be looking forward to the race in 2010.

As a part of the ongoing activities of the FOMITC, an annual meeting is held. Jesse Lipcon provided the summary of this event.

The Friends of MIT Crew held its annual meeting on Sunday June 5, 2005 in Pierce Boathouse following the 2005 Reunion Row. Approximately 20 FOMITC members and 5 board members attended. Board members in attendance were Jack Frailey (President), Jesse Lipcon, Kim Marvin, Linda Muri and David Oakes. Candace Royer and John Benedick, (Director and Assistant Director of the Department of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation, respectively) also attended. Candace Royer, who opened the meeting with some introductory remarks, was followed by a report on each crew by Gordon Hamilton (head coach, men's heavyweights), Ian Hutton (head coach, men's lightweights) and Dan Perkins (freshman coach, men's heavyweights). Jack Frailey facilitated a discussion of the agenda items.

A number of agenda items were discussed

including recruiting, a brief financial overview, planned boat dedications, the FOMITC web site, alumni boat photos, Squaring the Blade publications, the mentoring program, and the reunion row. Future projects include growing parent involvement in the program, increasing alumni and parent presence at races, and additional coordination with the Sloan rowing program and alumni. Special attention was paid to the highly successful recruiting efforts for the men's heavyweight squad led by Dan Perkins.

Stu Schmill, former coach and Director of the Boathouse and now Associate Director of Admissions and Director of MIT's Educational Council, closed the meeting with a reading of the election results for the 2005-2006 FOMITC Board of Directors. 311 rowing alumni voted in the election representing 7.7% of the rowing alumni population of MIT. This was a 28% higher turnout rate than recent voting for the Alumni Association's National Selection Committee. Thank you to everyone who participated.

This past year's Annual Banquet was held on October 22, and featured Mike Teti as guest speaker. Mikewas named the United States Men's Olympic Team coach after the Games of 1996 and his eight won Olympic Gold. Attendance was excellent; one hundred and sixteen students and twenty-four alumni were in the audience. (Squaring the Blade for Fall, 2005).

To conduct the business of the FOMITC the Board holds monthly meetings addressing the business of the organization and support of MIT's crew program. Twelve Board members participate in these calls. Melissa Jenkins '91, organized the meetings in her capacity as FOMITC Secretary.

Future Activities

The Board intends to focus in the coming year on increasing the involvement of alumni with the rowing program and each other, and on supporting DAPER in its implementation of the RAC report recommendations.

In addition, the financial goal for fiscal year 2006 is \$324,000 of which \$80,000 has been earmarked for three racing shells for women's crew. Board member Barbara Ostrom, '78 writes this about it:

There are multiple inputs to a winning season, crew, coxswain, coaching and equipment. The Friends recognize that the heart and drive of the boat are people trained, ambitious and driving for the win. While students with focused training and coaching can make the boat go fast, not all boats go equally fast for the same amount of effort. I remember training in Pococks and what a difference using one of the original fiberglass shells made (the men weren't on the water that day).

The Lightweight Women's crew has traditionally made do with the available shells. This year the Friends is conducting a fund-raising effort to provide them with a racing eight

designed and rigged specifically for their use. This should make them more competitive for the same effort given better boats. It will also provide them equivalent equipment to their Ivy competition.

The fund-raising effort has an \$80,000 goal to purchase this eight and two fours rigged, oared, and wired for sound. The effort kicked off with \$30,000 in pledges and additional funds have been coming in during the fall. Women who rowed at MIT in the 1970s got advance notice of this effort. Additional mailings and phone calls to follow up are in progress. If you haven't made a contribution to MIT crew for this purpose, please consider doing so.

The Board will continue its traditions that support involvement of crew members, past, present, and future in the rowing program through the Annual Fall Banquet, the Reunion Row 2006 and the Annual Meeting 2006. In addition, the Board expects to be active in supporting MIT crews participating in the Head of the Charles and organizing shell dedications for new boats.

Proposed Bylaw Amendments

It's time for a change!

We, the Board of Directors, ask your approval of a number of changes to our organization and bylaws that recognize more appropriately what we have been and should be doing and will improve how effectively we do it. They will allow us to work with MIT much more efficaciously, and better serve not only MIT's rowing program, but our crew alumni/ae members as well.

Since the inception of the Friends of MIT Crew twenty years ago, we have been steadily growing and learning. Some of what we've learned has led to incremental changes in how we discharge our responsibilities while others have been more significant. For several months now the Board of Directors has been discussing how much we've learned over the last three years, and now feels the need to amend the Friends' bylaws. Over our last several meetings, we voted to amend the bylaws in three important ways.

I. Enhancing our Mission

Underlying these changes is the formal recognition and adoption of a philosophy borne from our experiences over the last three years – a philosophy that more accurately reflects how the Board has been pursuing its most important goal, i.e., to restore and maintain excellence in the intercollegiate rowing program. This philosophy relates the organization's mission to an alumni service in addition to our traditional role in support of the intercollegiate crew program, as a way to more fully engage crew alums inside a broader and more frequent communication network. In that way we plan to conceive and implement new ways to rekindle your enthusiasm so that you will re-involve yourselves with the overall program and willingly enhance your support of our mission.

This first change is clearly illustrated in the mission redefinition cited in Bylaws Section 1.02, approved unanimously by the Board:

The mission of the MIT Crew Alumni Association is: (a) to encourage the maintenance of the crew program at the highest possible level of excellence, no less than its traditional competitors; (b) to provide financial support and inspiration toward that end; and (c) to provide the means for alumni to retain a close relationship with the crew program, their crewmates, and current student athletes.

II. Changing Our Name

The second change is simply an accurate reflection of our enhanced Mission Statement and the actual role of our organization. We will continue, as we have

done for twenty years, to work closely with the Department of Athletics, Physical Education, and Recreation (DAPER) to provide and encourage support for the intercollegiate crew program.

Since the Board of Directors was established, we have also been increasingly relating to and drawing upon the resources of the MIT Alumni Association – working together to host the Reunion Row at each of the annual spring reunions, managing our crew alumni contacts and mailing lists, coordinating our fund raising efforts with MIT’s annual and five-year reunion fund drives, improving how we connect our crew alumni with the MIT community, current student athletes and fellow alumni. Our mentoring program is just one example.

Our mission with respect to Crew Alumni so closely parallels that of the MIT Alumni Association for the alumni population as a whole that, in truth, we are the MIT Crew Alumni Association and have voted (11-1) that the organization’s name be changed accordingly.

III. Small changes for improved efficiency

We are also proposing many smaller changes to the bylaws. Most of these are to clarify and “clean up” inconsistencies and delete unnecessary language. Other changes will

- Make appointments of Vice Presidents (4.04); ballot for annual election of Directors (5.01); and charge of committees (5.03) subject to approval of the Board of Directors
- Separate the Board of Directors’ and Officers’ elections from the annual Friends membership meeting (2.02, 3.08, and 4.01)

- Separate the annual Board of Directors meeting from the annual Friends membership meeting (3.07)
- Make it a tad easier to amend the bylaws (8.01) – an especially important feature in a young organization while still in the process of learning how best to govern itself.

IV. In Summary

Will these changes affect who we are, what we do, or our commitment to our alumni/ae and the rowing program – absolutely not! Will these changes affect how productively we can work and how much we are able to do with our resources on your behalf – ABSOLUTELY! By setting up the Board structure to better undertake our new mission and by moving closer organizationally to the MIT Alumni Association, we will be far better prepared to meet the challenges that lie ahead.

We strongly believe it is time for these changes, and ask that you vote to ratify the Board’s decisions in these matters. As MIT moves forward, so too must we in order to better serve both the rowing program and our alumni.

V. Your Vote

But perhaps the above descriptions and rationale are sufficient for you to decide how to vote on them. In either case, please vote on line as directed or on the attached ballot and return according to the directions noted.

The Friends Bylaws require that each election “take into account diversity, including but not limited to age, gender and undergraduate rowing experience such that membership of the Board is reasonably representative of the entire membership of Friends.”

Please note that there are two Women’s Crew candidates and eight Men’s Crew candidates. It is Board policy to consider Sahar Aminipour in the latter category since she was a member of a men’s squad throughout her four years in the crew program.

We ask that you vote for one Women’s Crew alum and four Men’s Crew alums so there will be a total of three (3) Women’s Crew and twelve (12) Men’s Crew alums serving on the Board. Currently, 22% of Friends are Women’s Crew alums and 78% are Men’s Crew alums. In future elections, there will be openings for four Men’s Crew and one Women’s Crew alums each year.
